#### Groupings in subjects

Grouping in history, geography, PSHCE & DT are less strictly based on prior attainment and are agreed between subject groups.

Music, art and drama are mixed ability groupings.



# Making the right GCSE Choices



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LONG TERM GOALS - certain degree courses require specific A levels


| Degree level course | A level subjects often required  |  |
|---------------------|--|--|
| Biology             | Biology and another science or maths   |  |
| Chemistry           | Chemistry and sometimes maths and/or another science                             |  |
| Dentistry           | Chemistry and one or two other sciences  |  |
| Engineering         | Maths and physics (or maths and chemistry for<br>chemical engineering)           |  |
| Maths               | Maths  |  |
| Medicine            | Chemistry and usually one or two other sciences. Some require biology            |  |
| Modern languages    | Usually the language to be studied – but this may vary for less common languages |  |
| Veterinary Science  | Chemistry and one or two other sciences  |  |


