Period related absence/ issues

Schools will not, as a matter of course authorise time off for period related absence. Mild/moderate cramps are normal, and symptoms can be eased by taking general over the counter medication such as paracetamol.

Pharmacists can also recommend more targeted products if necessary, and should generally be the first port of call, rather than the GP.

We would ask that parents contact the school medical officer if the student has any health conditions linked to period issues such as endometriosis. Special arrangements can be made in these cases.

In more severe cases we ask that parents seek advice via the GP, who can liaise with the community school nurse regarding the need for absence from school.

School has a supply of pads, tampons and fresh underwear should students need these during the school day.

NON-UNIFORM DAY - KS3/KS4 (detailed)

NON- UNIFORM DAYS DRESS CODE	On occasions when students are permitted to wear their own clothes (charity fund raisers, school trips and visits), it is important that students dress appropriately as the school is still a working environment.Hats should be removed inside the school building.
	 Slash jeans should not be worn.
	 Skirts, shorts and dresses should be at least mid-thigh length
	 Usual school rules still apply to hair colouring.
	The following clothing is not allowed:
	 see-through clothing (e.g. see through blouses),
	 strapless or spaghetti strapped tops,
	 clothing that reveals the midriff,
	 clothing with inappropriate logos or slogans, this includes clothing that could be considered political or partisan.
	 flip flops, high heels or backless footwear.
	 Large hooped earrings are not permitted for health and safety reasons.
	 Nail extensions/false nails are not permitted for health and safety reasons.
	Moderate makeup and nail varnish is permitted on a 'non-uniform' day but should be removed before the following school day.

Here is a copy of the Year 11 and Year 13 November 2024 Mock Examination Timetables along with a copy of the mock examinations instructions and information booklet for students and parents. Please make sure that you have read through this prior to starting your mock examinations.

Here are some quick reminders:

- **Be Ready by being equipped** - Make sure that you come to the examinations with all the equipment that you require for it. There is limited equipment to be lent out, especially with calculators it may not be the brand or model you are used to using.

- **Be Ready to start** - Make sure that you are arriving ten minutes before the stated start time so that you are sat down and ready to start the exam punctually.

- **Be Resepectfully silent** - Make sure that you are silent from the point that you enter the examination hall until you have left the sixth form block after your examination. Don't show disrespect to those students that are still doing their examination.

- **Be Respectful to your environment by sitting in the correct seat** - Make sure that you are sat in the correct seat, you can check on the seating plans outside the room or on the individual timetables that you have been given.

- **Be Resilient by trying your best** - Your best is the most you can say you have given. Leave every exam being able to say to yourself (I tried my hardest in that exam and I gave it my all).
