## Wider personal development - update on October opportunities

In October, our students have taken part in a variety of opportunities.

Year 13 social science students visited the Police museum in Birmingham to see the history of crime and they also visited the houses of Parliament and the Supreme Court in London to learn more about the law and the British value, democracy.

Both year 12 and 13 Geographers went to Stratford Upon Avon where they collected vital data about human geography needed for their assessments and then to the Museum of Geology at the University of Birmingham to support their learning in coastal environments and tectonics.

All year 7 students attended a special ceremony at the Foundation Office as a welcome to the King Edwards VI Trust. All year 12 students went to a careers and apprenticeship show at Edgbaston Cricket ground to find out about the career opportunities for them when they move to the next stage of their education.

Year 11 Business studies students visited two Merlin group businesses, the Sealife Centre and Legoland, in Brindley place. This enabled them to apply their learning of branding, marketing and market segmentation.

All year 11 students attended a revision workshop delivered by MADE training. They learnt a variety of revision techniques which will be invaluable for their forthcoming mock examinations in November. The feedback from students was very positive, commenting that it was "a great session, full of useful strategies for learning that can be used in a range

of situations, from a school/ college environment, to the workplace or as part of your own personal development. Delivery was engaging, lively and demonstrated real commitment to student experience".

A selection of year 9 students attended a special day at the university of Birmingham to experience the subjects on offer in order to raise their aspirations.

Finally sixth form students had a social evening out at the Hollywood Bowl and the year 7 and 8 students had a halloween disco to help develop social skills and make new friends.

Opportunities being planned for the next half are 'Science Live', a year 7 theatre trip to see 'A Christmas Carol' and the school Christmas fair.
