Be Ready for School

Uniform

As we near the end of another fantastic term, please can parents use this opportunity to check that all uniform still fits, we have a number of students who have grown and therefore have trousers and skirts that no longer meet the uniform guidelines. We also find that after every holiday we have students return without school shoes because they

discover that they are too small after the Christmas break. Please can you ensure that this is checked prior to Tuesday 7th Jan.

Talking point

There is a lot of evidence that shows that spoken language skill is one of the strongest predictors of a child's future life chances.

- Students with increased oracy have more emotional confident, improved peer relationships and higher emotional wellbeing
- Oral language ability plays an important role in GCSE attainment; students with higher language ability are more likely to achieve higher grades in Maths, English and English Literature
- On leaving school, children with poor verbal communication skills are less likely to find employment and more likely to suffer from mental health difficulties.

Sadly national evidence also highlights that students anxiety and nervousness about speaking increases as they move though secondary school. This is something that we are keen to avoid for students attending KEVI LSG.

We provide a range of opportunities for students to develop their spoken language skills in lessons and through extra curricular activities, but just like other elements of learning, we know that practicing skills at home can really help support learning in school.

As a parent of a secondary school student myself, I am fully aware of how difficult it can be to get teenagers to engage in conversation, we will therefore be adding a 'talking point' to each bulletin moving forward. This will be shared with parents, students and teachers so we are all working together to develop oracy skills and students can really think about how they develop their response so please do ask them the question each week.

The questions/prompts have been developed by a team of professionals who specialise in oracy. We encourage you to use the prompts as conversation starters, maybe when driving somewhere with your child, or whilst preparing dinner or eating a meal. I have been trying these prompts with my own child and have found out so much about him in a relatively short period of time, at the same time as developing his oracy skills.

The talking point for this week is:

'What traditions do you have and which ones you want to continue with when you are older'

Activities out of school

Does your child do any activities outside of school e.g. swimming, dancing, athletics, guides, scouts, singing, acting, craft, cadets, kickboxing.

If so, we would love to know about them!

We are very aware that many of our students have fantastic and exciting lives outside of school and we love it when students tell us about these experiences... However, we are very conscious that only a small proportion of students will be telling us about these activities and as such we could be missing opportunities to make the curriculum more interesting and relevant. We could also be missing out on opportunities to share in their excitement about upcoming events or to congratulate them on their successes.
