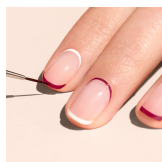


Tuesday 8th July - Year 8 students can wear face art for the day by donating £1 online via the KEVI LSG app.

NON-UNIFORM DAY – KS3/KS4 (detailed)

NON-UNIFORM DAYS DRESS CODE	On occasions when students are permitted to wear their own clothes (charity fund raisers, school trips and visits), it is important that students dress appropriately as the school is still a working environment. • Hats should be removed inside the school building. • Slash jeans should not be worn. • Skirts, shorts and dresses should be at least mid-thigh length • Usual school rules still apply to hair colouring. The following clothing is not allowed: • see-through clothing (e.g. see through blouses), • strapless or spaghetti strapped tops, • clothing that reveals the midriff, • clothing with inappropriate logos or slogans, this includes clothing that could be considered political or partisan. • flip flops, high heels or backless footwear. • Large hooped earrings are not permitted for health and safety reasons. • Nail extensions/false nails are not permitted for health and safety reasons. Moderate makeup and nail varnish is permitted on a 'non-uniform' day but should be removed before the following school day.

Parents Evenings Consultation

Online parents evenings were introduced in 2020 as a result of the pandemic. However, as a result of the feedback we have received from parents, we are currently reviewing whether to remain with online parents evenings, or revert back to the face to face meetings that were in place prior to covid.

There are advantages and disadvantages of both systems.
A summary of some of these points can be found below:

	Advantages	Disadvantages
Online meetings	• No wasted time as appointments are back to back • No expense/time travelling to and from school • Advanced booking that is accurate • No need to find child care for younger siblings • Parents can attend the same meeting from different locations e.g work and home • Teachers can plan in advance because they definitely know the order that parents will be seen • Privacy to discuss issues without being overheard • Fair allocation of appointment times	• Can feel less personal • Less opportunities for parents to visit the school (although all parents will be invited to a curriculum evening each year) • Potential technical issues • Difficult for families without access to the internet.
Face to face meeting	• Opportunity for parents to visit the school • More personal • Opportunity to collect paper documents (although these can be shared electronically with online parents evenings)	• For some parents it is difficult to come to school e.g. transport issues • For some parents it is difficult to get to school in time (due to the transport time from where they work) • It is challenging to find a parking space close to the

		school (there would be no parking on site) • Time taken to undertake all appointments would be double that required for an online parents evening as 5 min movement time would be required between appointments • Less privacy as all appointments would take place in the hall • It can get very loud/busy which some parents/students find distracting • Potential conflict where parents without appointments attempt to see teachers/take longer than their allocated slot. • Can be challenging for parents who are separated
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What is the same for both online and face to face meetings :

- The number of parents evenings per year (one per year group)
- The time allocated per appointment (5min per appointment, if in person there will be a bell to signify the end of each appointment)
- The start and end time for parents evening (4pm-6:30pm)
- Appointments will be booked in advance via the current online booking system.
- Only parents with a scheduled appointment will be seen.
- If a teacher is absent due to ill health - appointments will not take place (parents will be called on a different day if they request contact)
- If parents are late for an appointment, the appointment will not be able to take place at a different time.
