Timetable



- Subject lessons 30 hours
- Morning form time 10 x 20 mins 3 ½ hours
- 1 Life Choices lesson per week 2 hours
- 1 co-curricular enrichment lessons per fortnight 1 or 2 hours
- 3 supervised study sessions per week 6 hours (2 hours per subject)
- 9 onsite independent study sessions 9 hours (3 hours per subject)

Dress Code

Students **should not** wear:

- Any items that feature provocative images or slogans
- Clothes that are overly revealing including visible underwear, ripped jeans, designer or otherwise
- Footwear which could cause damage to flooring or pose a health & safety risk such as flip flops, high heels or backless footwear
- Science students must wear fully enclosed shoes
- Extreme piercings and tattoos are not considered appropriate for the sixth form environment


For safeguarding reasons students must be recognisable as members of Lordswood Sixth Form Centre:

Use of Mobile Devices



In Lessons

The use of mobile devices in lessons is **permitted at the discretion of the teacher** and must be for work related purposes only. If the teacher feels a mobile device is being **used inappropriately they can confiscate your device** until the end of the lesson or the end of the school day depending on the seriousness of the misuse.

In Main School

Mobile devices and headphones/ear pods are only permitted in the sixth form area. Use in the main school is not permitted and will result in confiscation.

Independent Study




- Year 12 for the first term students will remain on site from 8.30am 3.00pm. This is to help introduce them to independent working and the sixth form environment.
- From January (Spring Term) they will be able to leave site from lunchtime onwards if they are free period 5. This will enable them to work from home during this time.
- If your child have any areas for development such as attainment, attendance, punctuality or negative behaviour, this privilege will be removed.
- Students must sign in/out every time they arrive or leave the site.





During your child's supervised study lessons they will complete tasks in our Bridging the Gap programme. The programme will support your child in the transition from GCSE to Level 3 and covers the following topics

- Form tutors they will see their form tutor each morning where they can discuss any issues.

Special Educational Needs support is available for students throughout sixth form. If your child is joining us from another school and has received support in the past, and it has not been added to the application form please email school or ask your child to come and speak to any member of staff.

Safeguarding and Wellbeing



You can speak to any member of staff if you have a concern. The sixth form has a Student Support Officer who can offer one-to-one support.

You can also get a referral our independent well-being and counselling service Place2Be, or speak to them independently using the Place2Talk service.

Wellbeing support agencies are signposted around the school. The school has a large safeguarding and pastoral support team who are trained to support students.







Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG)





- All Y12 spend a one week block placement on Work Experience

Attendance, Punctuality and Bursary

Daily Routine: Entering the School Site



- Students enter the school site by the Knightlow Road
 Entrance or Lordswood Road
- All gates are locked at 8.25am for safety reasons
- Students enter the sixth form using the 6th form courtyard.
- Students need to swipe in and out using their ID card or the Signing in App every time they enter or leave school

Attendance and Punctuality



Attendance and punctuality are essential to ensure your child makes the most progress during their time at KEVI LSG.

Minimum expectation: 96% attendance. Minimum Expected Guided Learning Hours: 195 hours per subject per year

Students who do not attend the minimum expected guided learning hours will no longer be considered to be full-time students.

More than 20 days consecutive absence: removal from roll


Attendance concerns



Attendance is monitored daily, concerns will be discussed as follows:

- Stage 1 student conversation with Attendance & Bursary Officer
- Stage 2 parent conversation with Attendance & Bursary Officer letter home
- Stage 3 student conversation with Head of Year & Attendance Officer
- Stage 4 parent meeting in school with Attendance Officer & Head of Year
- Stage 5 parent meeting with Director of Post 16 Studies & Attendance Officer
- In addition, the Educational Welfare Officer may also arrange home visits if the school have any concerns about a students safety or wellbeing.

Punctuality concerns (arriving to school late)



- Stage 1 student & parent conversation with Attendance and Bursary Officer
- Stage 2 student conversation with Head of Year & Attendance
 Officer
- Stage 3- parent meeting with Head of Year & Attendance Officer

Daily Routine: Reporting an Absence



- Absences must be reported by 9.00am on each day a student is unable to attend due to illness
- Absences must be reported through StudyBugs by a parent/carer, not the student
- Absences MUST NOT be reported by email.

Daily Routine: Appointments



- If your child has an appointment they must give the school at least 24 and excellence for our City hours
- The following absences will be authorised:
- Hospital, orthodontist, university interviews and open days, driving tests, certain religious holidays
- The following absences will NOT be authorised
- standard doctor or dentist appointments, driving lessons
- Any appointments that can be made out of normal school hours
- The school does not authorise holidays in term time.

Lateness to lessons during the day

- Students are expected to arrived to all lessons on time
- Students who arrive late will receive a late mark
- The school will monitor daily which students arrive late
- Students who have received multiple late marks for the day will be issued a behaviour point





- 1st offence 30 minutes in reset
- 2nd offence- 30 minutes in reset and 3 day attendance
 Monitoring and a parent call home
- 3rd offence 1 hour in reset and 5 day attendance monitoring

Applying for Bursary



- 16-19 Bursary Funding is to support students financially with any barriers to their learning.
- Funding is to provide travel costs, stationery, text books and equipment
- Access the online application via the link which will be sent to your school email address
- Complete the application form you will need to upload evidence of household income (£30,000 or less)
- Evidence must include all benefits received. If parents/carers work, evidence of salary/wages must be added in addition)

Once your application has been approved and accepted, the Bursary Support Officer will be in touch to help you access the equipment you need by completing a full Needs Assessment with you.

Further details can be found on the school website or you can collect an information sheet from the sixth form entrance area. Please ask if you have any questions.

Applying for Free School Meals



Internal Students: If you have previously applied online for free school meals through the school website you will continue to receive free school meals. This will be added to your lunch card. If you believe you are entitled to free school meals but have not previously applied you will need to do so.

Joining students: If you received free school meals at your previous school you will need to reapply.
